International Women's Day



Sunday 8th March is International Women's Day (IWD). This year the theme is 'Each for Equal'.

The IWD website reminds us that an equal world is an enabled world & that individually, we're all responsible for our own thoughts and actions - all day, every day.

IWD provides us with a platform to actively challenge stereotypes, fight bias, broaden perceptions, improve situations & celebrate women's achievements.

The IWD 2020 campaign theme is drawn from a notion of 'Collective Individualism'; we are all parts of a whole. Our individual actions, conversations, behaviours and mindsets can have an impact on our larger society.

Our Year 12 student leaders were asked to share with us some information about a woman who they find inspiring, and to explain what the theme 'Each for Equal' means to them.

Courtney Sait (School Captain)

An inspiring woman for me... is Rosa Parks. She played a large role in the commencement of the American civil rights movement and she stood up for what she believed in. She challenged stereotypes and the gender roles which were placed on women at the time by 'not doing as she was told.' She aimed to improve the treatment of African Americans. Her work as a civil rights activist inspired many Australians, especially Indigenous Australians, and she has helped society to get to where it is today.



To me, the theme 'Each for Equal' means... to strive to make men and women equal in society and in the workplace. In the workplace women are not given equal opportunities to men, are paid unequally and are also treated differently to men. I hope that this day will help us get closer to equality, and it also allows the achievements of women to be acknowledged and accredited. I hope that we can continue strive for equality as it will help us grow as not only people but as a nation.

Cobi Fitzpatrick (School Captain)

An inspiring woman is... my Nana, because she is the unsung hero of the farm. She undertakes household duties, keeps the garden, caters for workers, acts as a farm taxi and keeps the books, and many more tasks. She is a jack-of-all-trades and an inspiration to me.



To me, the theme 'Each for Equal' means... that no matter the job, situation, time or conversation, everyone in the world is equal and responsible for his or her own thoughts and actions.

Rose McGeown (School Vice-Captain)

An inspiring woman for me... is Malala Yousafzai. She is an incredibly strong and brave woman, who at 15 years of age was shot in an attempt to silence her calls for equal education opportunities for both boys and girls in Pakistan, after the Taliban took control of her village. Once she had recovered after multiple surgeries in the UK, she decided to start the Malala Fund, a charity dedicated to giving every girl an opportunity to achieve the future she chooses. In 2014, Malala was the youngest ever recipient of a Nobel Peace Prize in recognition of her work. She is now studying Philosophy, Politics and Economics at the University of Oxford, while continuing to fight for free, safe education for all girls, everywhere. I don't think I could ever truly understand what Malala and millions of other girls across



the world have been through trying to get such basic right as education, but her story reminds me that I, and all other girls in countries like Australia, are astonishingly lucky for the opportunities we have, and that I should always be grateful for my education.

To me, the theme 'Each for Equal' means... that each person should be trying to challenge stereotypes and outdated expectations of women all the time, to push everyone towards a more gender equal society.

Current Year 12 students will be requested to provide their Tax File Number (TFN) on enrolment to TAFE or university next year, so it is worthwhile getting an application submitted early! To acquire a Tax File number, you simply apply online and then have your identity verified through an interview at a participating Australia Post office. Apple Crumble

Serves 15

Apple crumble

- 6-8 apples, peeled, cored and cut into wedges
- handful of sultanas (or berries of your choosing)

Crumble topping

- 100g butter
- 1 cup plain flour
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 3 tblsp rolled oats
- 1 tsp baking powder
- 1 tsp ground cinnamon

Equipment

- Bowl
- Measuring jug
- Baking dish

Method:

- Preheat oven to 180 degrees celsius.
- Place apples and sultanas in a baking dish
- Pour over some water until about half the apples are covered
- Mix the butter through the dry ingredients with your fingers until all incorporated
- Using your hands strew the crumble mix over the apples, clumping some of the mix more than the rest
- Cook for 30mins or until the filling is bubbling around the sides, the apples are soft and the crumble topping nice and golden.
